Freedom of Borough to be conferred on Fire & Rescue **Service**

Ards and North Down Borough Council is set to confer its highest honour - the Freedom of the Borough on Northern Ireland Fire & Rescue Service (NIFRS).

This is in recognition and appreciation of the Service's unwavering dedication to duty and selfless service; its bravery in the face of danger; for saving lives and for protecting our community with great honour and distinction.

The formal ceremony to

bestow the Freedom will take place on 14 September 2024 and include a public display of firefighting skills by Firefighters from the local area at Bangor City Hall. NIFRS respond to fires,

road traffic collisions and specialist rescue incidents, including flooding, chemi-cal incidents, collapsed buildings and other types of emergencies to make Northern Ireland a safer place. In addition, NIFRS delivers a range of community engagement initiatives and provides advice on how to

stay safe from incidents it responds to. Northern Ireland Fire & Rescue Service Chief Fire & Rescue Officer, Aidan Jennings said: We are honoured to accept the prestigious Freedom of the Borough from Ards and North Down Borough Council. This is a testament to our Fire & Rescue Service and in particular to all of our Firefighters and support employees in the Ards and North Down area who serve the local community. It's a privilege for us to keep our people safe delivering a service that protects the community.

SPORTS FORUM GRANTS NOW OPEN

Sports clubs and aspiring athletes in Ards and North Down are being invited to apply for a Sports Forum Grant through Ards and North Down Borough Council.

A total of £45,000 has been set aside to help the Borough's affiliated clubs deliver quality sport in our area, while local athletes can also apply for funding to help ease the financial burden of travel and accommodation. They can also take advantage of a Goldcard which allows access to leisure facilities at reduced rates.

Clubs and individuals can apply for multiple grants until they reach their yearly (April 2024 to March 2025) limits, provided they qualify under the guidance notes.

Rachel Nixon is a Sports Forum working group member and is also a member of both Donaghadee Sailing club and Ballyholme Yacht Club Rachel said:

"Being part of the Ards and North Down Sports Forum working group is so exciting - seeing the best of all sports within the Borough and the amazing standard so many of our Clubs are functioning at. Confirmation from the Council on the new budget for 2024-5 is just brilliant and will continue to allow us to support our athletes and clubs across a huge

variety of sports.

"The grant scheme also facilitates and helps new Clubs get started up in the Borough. I would encourage all Sports Clubs in the Borough to connect with the Sports Forum and look at what opportunities are available. Whether it be developing your coaches or supporting your athletes at national and international level there are plenty of options.'

• Individual Travel and Accommodation: Grant value up to £500.

• Schools Clubs Pathway: Grant value up to £500.

18,000 trees planted in area during latest tree planting season

From November 2023 to March 2024, Ards and North Down Borough Council has facilitated the planting of 18,000 new trees across the Borough. This includes the planting of new woodland, native hedgerows, and community orchards.



Each of the tree planting events was made possible thanks to the help of community groups, schools and parks volunteers across the Ards and North Down

Council has an annual tree-planting programme which sees many trees of both native and interesting varieties planted during each tree planting season. The Council's STAND4TREES initiative aims to plant a tree for every person in the Borough, which is the Borough, which is approximately 160,000 trees

Trees play a significant in improving environmental conditions and people's quality of life. Trees act as carbon sinks and absorb carbon dioxide greenhouse gas) and produce oxygen. In addition, trees filter, absorb and reduce pollutants. Trees can make our Borough a healthier, more attractive and more comfortable place to live and work. Trees provide food and shelter for wildlife such as birds, squirrels

and insects, as well as for

people.

Below are the key aims of the he Council's Tree Woodland strategy Tree and guide the Council's management of trees in the Borough.

Community Engagement: to actively engage and collaborate with the community and others in valuing trees as a vital community asset.

Tree Planting: to increase the native tree canopy within the Borough by planting more trees to ensure

a healthy balanced tree population that positively responds to the impacts of climate change and urban expansion.

Managing Trees: to ensure good tree care, through sustainable management of the tree population and reducing risk.

WHY LIFE IN FULL COLOUR MATTERS FOR OUR POLLINATORS

What do bees see? Having evolved over millennia alongside native plants, bees are arguably one of the most important and successful insects.

There are many reasons for this, but one of them is how and what they see.

Their sight phenomenally good, in many respects superior to ours. They have composite eyes made up of thousands of lenses which enable them to navigate and maintain stability while seeking out food. And of course, flowers have evolved to attract bees and other flying insects through

shapes and, their particularly, colours.

We base our colour combinations (how 'see' colour) on red, blue and green, while bees base their colours on ultraviolet light, blue and green, so they can't see red, but can see reddish wavelengths, such as yellow and orange. According to scientists, the most likely colours to attract bees are violet

blue, but, as we know, they're partial to yellow dandelions in spring.

Their colour vision is also the fastest in the animal world, five times faster than humans. So, while we might struggle to distinguish one flower in a group, bees don't. They see each individual flower.

With their incredible vision, bees can pollinate plants with pinpoint accuracy. They can see what we



can't, and because of that ability, they're the ultimate pollinators.

Amazingly, responsible estimated 80% an of the pollination of all plants, and we humans are ultimately dependant on pollinated plants for food and survival. Yet, our sadly, bees are in serious decline around the world, including Ireland, because of degradation

poisoning of environment.

People can help in their own gardens. Businesses can help, communities can help, housing developers can help, schools can help, farmers can help, the list goes on and on. If we all pitch in, we can save our bees. Have a look at the excellent All-Ireland Pollinator Plan for ideas and simple guidance: https://pollinators.ie/

BELFAST HARBOUR WELCOMES NEW PILOT **BOAT HIBERNIA TO ITS MARINE FI**

Belfast Harbour has this week taken delivery of its newest vessel, the Pilot Boat Hibernia, which represents a £1.5m investment in its marine fleet.

Hibernia will be tasked with transporting pilots to and from ships calling at Belfast as part of the service provided by Belfast Harbour which helps ships safely navigate through the port, to and from their designated berth.

Belfast Harbour more than handles 23.9 million tonnes of trade every year and its pilot boat fleet needs to operate 24 hours a day 365 days a year, therefore it is vital to ensure downtime is kept to a minimum.

vessel. The new built by Holyhead Marine Services, will replace PB4; the oldest pilot boat in Belfast Harbour's fleet, which is being retired after 24 years of service.

With a lightweight, resin infused hull and refined shape, the new Hibernia has a fuelefficient hull design and engines that are able to run on Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil (HVO) helping to reduce carbon emissions from pilot boat operations. It is also believed that it will be the first pilot vessel on the island of Ireland equipped with a selective catalytic

reduction exhaust system, which reduces nitrous oxide emissions. The name Hibernia

has a strong history and connection with Harbour. Belfast William Ritchie started shipbuilding in the city in 1791, on the site of the future Harbour Office.

Within a year, the 300 tonne Hibernia was launched, which began trading between Belfast, New York and the Caribbean. Over 230 years later Belfast Harbour is proud to bring the new Pilot Hibernia

Most popular times of the year to quit smoking

New analysis has identified the months of the year when most people show interest in stopping smoking, with spring months of March and May ranking second and third.

The study conducted by GoSmokeFree analysed searches Google quitting-related terms made across UK regions over the last three years and scaled this against local populations to calculate the searches made per 100k

Terms analysed include 'give up smoking',' smoking cessation aids', and 'nicotine gum'. Searches for fitness-related terms like 'gyms near me and 'exercise routines' were also compared to see if people prioritise fitness alongside their lung health.

The most popular time of year is January for both fitness and quitting smoking, with an average of 893,110 and 440,670 Google searches made related to each goal.

This spike can be attributed to New Year's

individuals set goals for the upcoming year that often focus on improving their health. The start of a new year symbolises a fresh start and motivates many to stop smoking. March is the second

most popular time to kick the habit, with 438,830 average monthly searches for quitting smoking made across the UK smoking However, fitness goes on the backburner with March sitting in 11th place with 643.030 searches.

As the weather begins to warm up, March could see an increase in quitting attempts - albeit not as high as January - as the beginning of spring might symbolise renewal and motivate some to restart their New Year's



Like March, May marks the onset of spring; a time when people engage in outdoor activities and may want to quit smoking their health and fitness

The improved weather conditions also can enhance mood and increase motivation to pursue lifestyle changes. This is evident in the data, as May took third place as the best month to quit with 410,920

per month.

May took fifth for health and well-being queries 819,680 overall, meaning it's on people's minds, but not as prevalent as at the start of the year.

With 406,510 average searches for stopping smoking-related October's increase in interest that places it in fourth may be due campaigns like Stoptober actively encouraging

With November and December leading into and during the holiday season, they likely see reduced quitting attempts due to

social gatherings, holiday stress, and a general postponement of major lifestyle changes until after

November takes fifth 402,570 with place quitting-related searches and December ranks last (12th) for smoking

cessation-related queries with 355,190.

Action needed to address the decline of iconic bird of prey - Muir The restoration of nesting and foraging habitats is essential if we are to reverse the decline of one of

our rarest birds of prey, DAERA Minister Andrew Muir has warned.

His comments come after a new DAERA part-funded survey reveals the Hen Harrier, a priority species in Northern Ireland, has declined by more than 26 per cent since 2016.

Minister Muir said: "I am concerned with the findings from the 2023 UK Hen Harrier survey that we have a declining population in Northern Ireland with a decrease from 46 pairs to 34 pairs, since the last national census in 2016. Factors in the decline of this raptor have been well documented and include the loss suitable breeding habitats. habitat degradation, the climate, predation and wildfires.

"Action needs to be taken to stop the decline of this iconic bird, but it can only be achieved through working partnership with landowners, farmers, Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) and all other stakeholders, to restore and enhance breeding habitats and appropriately manage activities which have the potential to cause disturbance displacement."

predominately breed in heather moorland and young coniferous forest plantations during their breeding season. Their prey includes small bird species such as Skylarks Meadow Pipits. and Northern Ireland decline almost mirrors a decline of one third (33 percent) in the Republic of Ireland Hen Harrier population since 2022. DAERA has listed

the species as one of principal importance for the purpose of conserving biodiversity here and has designated two Special Protection Areas (SPAs) under the EU Birds Directive to protect the Hen Harrier breeding during its season

Minister Muir said he recognised the important work of the UK-wide survey which organised by the RSPB



at a national level and locally by the Northern Ireland Raptor Study Group (NIRSG).

"While the encouraging, I am pleased that survey showed the number of Hen within Harriers two designated Special Protection Areas, approximately half the population, remained relatively stable since the 2016 census." the Minister

continued.



THE ORIGINS **OF BALLOO IN BANGOR**

Balloo, sometimes spelled as "Ballow," is a locality near Bangor, Northern Ireland. Its name carries echoes of centuries past, and its significance lies in its historical context.

Here are some key points about Balloo:

Early Settlement: The origins of Balloo date back to the early 6th century AD when Bangor Cathedral was founded. Bangor itself has a rich history, and Balloo became part of the Kingdom of Gwynedd.

Nicholson Family: Balloo has strong ties to the Nicholson family. The first Nicholson to settle in Ulster arrived in Ballymagee, near Bangor, during the reign of James I. William Nicholson (1587-1665) was one of the early family members associated with Balloo.

Balloo House: Balloo House, was a coaching house that the McConnell family acquired in 1893. It stood about half a mile east of the Bangor-Newtownards approximately one and a half miles south of Bangor. The property had been in the possession of the Nicholson family since 1641, as evidenced by a stone inscribed "W N 1641" built into a quoin. The house itself was of 18th and early 19th-century origin.



Steele-Nicholsons: Steele-Nicholsons owned 402 acres of land in County Down, including Balloo. William Nicholson-Steele-Nicholson (1772-1840)played a significant role in the family's legacy. He married Isabella Hancock and assumed the additional surname of Nicholson, as per his Uncle William's testamentary injunction. The family's influence extended through generations, with Balloo House at its heart.

Balloo's Legacy

Woodland Balloo Woodland Nature Reserve, managed by the Woodland Trust, is the last remnant of the gardens of Balloo House. The reserve features mature trees. including oaks believed to be over 300 years old.

Mausoleum: The grounds of Balloo House once housed a family mausoleum, known locally as "Nickys tomb." Built in 1792, it was later demolished in 1976,

and the remains of William Steele-Nicholson were reinterred in the family plot at Bangor Abbey.



EDDIE IRVINE: THE UNCONVENTIONAL RACER WHO **LEFT HIS MARK ON FORMULA ONE!**

Eddie Irvine, is a name that resonates with both triumph and controversy, graced the Formula One circuits during the late 20th century.

Born on November 10, 1965, in Newtownards, , Irvine's journey from a young karting enthusiast to a seasoned F1 driver is a tale of audacity, talent, and occasional turbulence.

Milan12.

CANCER SCREENING SAVES LIVES' LIVING WELL CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED

As part of the Living Well service, community pharmacies are highlighting the importance of attending for screening when invited.

The 'Cancer screening saves lives' campaign will run in over 500 community throughout pharmacies April and May and aims increase awareness of the cancer screening programmes available in Northern Ireland and to encourage all of those who are eligible to participate.

There are three screening programmes in Northern Ireland - breast, bowel and cervical which aim to detect cancer, or risk of cancer, early. The programmes are aimed at those who don't have any symptoms of cancer.




