

East Belfast mum opens up about living with Huntington's Disease

An East Belfast mum has opened up about living with Huntington's Disease.

The hereditary disorder of the central nervous system causes gradual loss of control of thoughts, feelings, behaviour, movement, communication swallow until patients become wholly dependent on care. There is currently no cure or any means of slowing the disease which affects around 200 men and women in Northern Ireland with symptoms usually starting to show from 35-50 years.

East Belfast mum-ofthree Lynsay Hands was 16 when her mum was diagnosed with Huntington's Disease. If you have the condition there is a 50% chance that each of your children will get it. The 38-year-old said: "On the 23rd August 2011 my whole life was turned upside down when my test results came back positive. When the nurse told me that I had HD I $\,$ screamed and ran out of the room.

"Six years on and I suffer from severe depression and anxiety which makes it hard for me to go out. I also have really bad mood swings and I'm lucky to get a couple of hours sleep

a night. I get the odd movement in my arms and legs which makes walking about very hard.

"My kids Amy-Lee, 16, Carter, 14, and Katy, 11, help around the house, my brother and sister are nearby and I've friends that do the shopping for me which is great. I do get times were I would just sit and cry and say why me? but I keep fighting for the sake of my kids.

"A year ago I started going to the HDANI Belfast support group. The first time I went I cried for two hours but it was the best thing because they listened to me and answered my questions. I shared my story and heard other peoples.

peoples.
"I worry about my children and whether they will get HD. They know that I have the disease and they've seen their granny suffer so know what lies ahead.

"I try to answer their questions honestly but it's really hard. HDANI started a youth group which was brilliant because the kids went away and did stuff that I couldn't do with them and spent time talking about HD with a counsellor and other kids their own age.

"It really helped them and took the pressure off me. I know lots of charities are struggling for funding but I really don't know what I would do without HDA-NI- my Huntington's family- and would love to see more chances for patients and carers to come together and more help for our kids."



With development in progress for the Connswater Community Greenway let's take a look at what the project is all about.

The Connswater Community Greenway is a £40 million investment in East Belfast. The project has been developed by the East Belfast Partnership and is being delivered by Belfast City Council.



KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE ON THE INTERNET

Social networking is one of the revolutions of the online age and when used correctly is an excellent way of keeping in touch with friends and family. But it can also be a source of harm for your child or for you and other family members, via your child. New sites are springing up every day making it virtually impossible to keep a track off.

Do you know what sites your kids are using? Do you know how they work, what your children and the people they 'meet' on them can say or do on them? Most of us would probably answer no to these questions.

What can we do to change this, we can encourage our children to tell us which sites they're using, and ask them to show us how they work.

A number of potential dangers for our kids when using these sites include:

Chatting with people they think are new 'friends', but who



could actually intend to do them harm.

Sharing or viewing inappropriate or adult images or other content.

Being bullied or subject to other kinds of abuse.

es Being dared into carrying out danger-le ous or irresponsi-w ble acts on camera - 'neknominating'

Revealing personal or private information about themselves, friends or family. Or arranging to meet in person someone they've met online, when that person isn't who they said they were.

And though it may seem unthinkable, your child could be bullying or saying inappropriate things about somebody else, rather than being the target.

Teach your child to be very careful to befriend and communicate with only trusted people that they know. Tell them that revealing personal details such as their birth date, address, pet's name or teacher could give someone all the information they know to harm them. Teach them not to click on links or download from sites they have linked to.

Above all, assure them that it's OK to come to you or another trusted adult if they feel threatened by or uncomfortable about something they have seen or done on a social networking site.

Protect your kids because doing nothing is not an option as it's a sure-fire way to let your kids get into trouble.

Leading charity urgently seeking foster carers in Belfast

Action for Children Northern Ireland has spoken again of the urgent need for foster carers in Belfast.

Despite an unprecedented response to the charity's recent campaign across Northern Ireland there are still too few foster carers coming forward in Belfast.

Avery Bowser, children's services manager at Action for Children Northern Ireland, said: "We have been overwhelmed by the response to our campaign at the start of the year but we still don't have enough people coming forward in Belfast. That's why I'm putting out this urgent call to people in Belfast to ask themselves if they could provide a safe, secure and healing home for a child."

Avery explained "It is so important to have options that are local for the child. When that isn't available it means that children can be placed many miles from home. This can mean having to change school, and losing contact with friends and family."

We asked Avery if there were reasons for people not coming forward.

"It's really important to bust some of the myths around fostering because a lot of people assume they won't be considered. You need to be over 21, have a spare room and the ability to look after children who have usually had a very difficult start in life."

"We know that being a foster carer is complex

so we pay fees to reflect this, as well as allowances to cover care and leisure

Avery went on to explain the importance of finding foster carers from across the community. "At Action for Children celebrate diversity because we know our children are all different. We need carers from all walks of life so you can be married, co-habiting, in a same sex relationship or single. Gender, sexuality. race, ethnicity, religion and community background are all important parts of who you are that can help us to make the right match between carer and child."

SWIM INSTRUCTOR HELPING TO TURN THE TIDE FOR WATER SAFETY

Bangor based swimming instructor Mark Angus is implementing a new and unique water safety initiative in Northern Ireland which is aimed at raising awareness of safety in water throughout local communities.

The hands-on training scheme, called The Ripple Effect, has been launched by City of Belfast Swim Club and focuses on promoting water safety and drowning prevention and will equip local children with the knowledge and essential swimming skills needed to minimise dangerous incidents.

The Ripple Effect has launched in supbeen port of the UK drowning prevention strategy, which aims to reduce drowning fatalities in the UK by 50% by 2026, and is supported by the Royal Life Saving Society UK (RLSS UK), Speedo and Northern Ireland charity Hope for Youth. The initiative will see a roll-out of swimming education outreach and applied survival and life-saving lessons across schools in Belfast initially and subsequently throughout Northern Ireland. Kenny MacDermid, Na-

tional Drowning Prevention Coordinator, RLSS UK, the Drowning Prevention Charity said "RLSS UK is committed to a year on year reduction in drownings across the UK and Ireland and are delighted to be supporting this project. 400 people accidentally drown each year across the UK and statistics show that young males are most at risk. This excellent initiative equips the young

people of Belfast with the key skills they need to make well informed choices regarding their own personal safety in and around the water. At RLSS UK we are privileged to work with many families affected by drowning and see firsthand how devastating this can be not just to the family but the wider community and we are committed to putting a stop to these needless deaths."

Swimming instructor Mark Angus comments, "I am delighted to be playing a key role in implementing The Ripple Effect. We are rolling this out in three key stages; the initial stage involves primary school children participating in classroom and pool lessons led by coaches with RLSS UK National Pool Lifeguard Qualification (NPLQ) which include water safety presentations, practical floating techniques and life-saving activities. Stage two involves RLSS UK's Rookie Lifeguard award within the City of Belfast Swimming Club to transform enrolled children into mini lifeguards by teaching them valuable survival, rescue and sports skills that will enable them to enjoy water safely. The final phase of the year-long programme is an end of cross-community event that will celebrate and award each child's

achievement."

Tanya Martin, Chair, City of Belfast Swimming Club said: "Tragically too many young people are lost to the water each year due to insufficient survival skills or lack of swimming confidence. We hope The Ripple Effect will make waves about the dangers of water, both in a pool setting and in natural water outlets, and provide children with the vital skills to survive in water when adverse conditions strike."

The Ripple Effect is being piloted with Elmgrove Primary School in East Belfast and includes classroom and poolside lessons taking place at council-owned

Avoniel Leisure Centre. Designed to empower the children and remove barriers to water safety including socio-economic burdens, the initiative is supported by Hope for Youth NI which endeavours to provide funding for young people in Northern Ireland to partake in cross community activities irrespective of their backgrounds.

Commenting initiative, Hannah English, teacher at Elmgrove Primary School said: "Elmgrove is thrilled to be the first school in Northern Ireland to trial The Ripple Effect. After taking part in the programme's initial classroom and poolside lessons, we have had great feedback from the pupils regarding their understanding of the coach's key messages and have noticed a surge in their confidence in the swimming pool. The Ripple Effect has particular importance for our pupils because of the current regeneration work carried out in Avoniel Park which is making the Connswater River more visible. A number of pupils that walk to school walk past the river on their way to school so it given first-hand knowledge about water safety and life saving skills which is giving them the important tools to show responsibility around







£1.4 million Water Improvement Scheme Progressing Well - Road Closure Castle Road, Ballynure

NI Water is investing approximately £1.4 million to install a new 4km pipeline along the Ballyfore Road and Castle Road to improve the security of the water supply infrastructure for customers in the Ballynure, Straid and Raloo areas of East Antrim.

Work commenced on the Ballyfore Road in December 2016 and is now scheduled to continue on Castle Road. The completion point at the Castle Road/Castletown Road junction is anticipated to be completed by June 2017.

In order to carry out the work safely, it will be necessary to have a temporary road closure on Castle Road from 6 March for a duration of approximately 13 weeks.

The diversion route during this phase of the works will be via the Carrickfergus Road, turning left along the Watch Hill Road merging onto the Ballyrickard Road to the junction of Ballyrickard Road/Crosshill Road/ Ballyfore Road.

Traffic management and signage will be in place as the scheme progresses to try to minimise the impact of these works on businesses, residents, road users and the public. Vehicular access will be maintained for residents where possible and pedestrian access be maintained at all times. Normal working hours will be 7.30am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday; however it may be necessary at times for work to be carried out outside of these hours. Martin Gillen NI

Easter Symbols & Traditions

Christians celebrate Easter to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Some aspects of modern Easter celebrations, however, pre-date Christianity.

Ancient Spring Goddess

According to the Venerable Bede, Easter derives from Eostre, Anglo-Saxon goddess of spring. A month corresponding to April had been named "Eostremonat," or Eostre's month, leading to "Easter" becoming applied to the Christian holiday that usually took place within it. Prior to that, the holiday had been called Pasch (Passover), which remains its name in most non-English

(Based on the similarity of their names, some connect Eostre with Ishtar, the Babylonian and Assyrian goddess of love and fertility, but there is no solid evidence for this.)

It seems probable that around the second century A.D., Christian missionaries seeking to convert the tribes of northern Europe noticed that the Christian holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus roughly coincided with the Teutonic springtime celebrations, which emphasized the triumph of life over death. Christian Easter gradually absorbed the traditional symbols

BEEF PROCESSOR WELCOMES BDG GROUP

Opportunities to improve farm profitability through better beef supply chain linkages. This was the key topic for discussion at a recent Business Development group (BDG) meeting hosted by ABP food group at their beef processing plant in Newry.

During the visit the group were able to hear about current and future beef markets and the importance of a consistent supply of in spec beef cattle that can maximise the return to farmers. As a practical demonstration the group were able to grade live cattle and see how the carcase grades matched their predictions for weight, carcase conformation and fat class. Liam McCarthy, Supply Chain manager ABP, outlined that for cattle to maximise their value they have to be under 30 months of age for steers and heifers, farm quality assured, carcase weight between 270 and 400 kg and have a maximum of 4 moves. This was further reinforced as the group toured the

retail packing depart-

ment and were shown beef cuts from large carcases over 400 kg which weren't suitable for premium supermarket pre-packs.

Following the tour of the beef processing and retail production lines, Arthur Callaghan, NI Blade farming coordinator ABP, gave an outline of the Blade farming scheme and highlighted opportunities for beef finishers

to link with Blade calf rearing units.

The success and efficiencies of the farmers in the Northern Ireland Suckler Beef Programme was also discussed and it was highlighted that the linkages between farmers, ABP, CAFRE and the Irish Farmers Journal was helping to promote a system of profitable beef production.

The group visit to

ABP reinforced the importance of good communication between farmers and processors to ensure the supply of animals that meet market demands and also highlighted that there are opportunities for farmers to get involved with schemes such as the Blade farming scheme to add new enterprises or scale to their existing businesses.

Budding Attenboroughs get set for career in conservation, thanks to National Lottery funding

Twenty-one budding Attenboroughs from Northern Ireland are set to get the skills and training to pursue a career in nature conservation, thanks to a new three-year programme

funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF).

The programme, decharity's

livered by Ulster Wildlife, will receive over £400,000 in National Lottery funding to provide twenty-one paid training placements, prioritizing young people under the age of 24, from ethnic minority groups or those with a disability. One-year part-time traineeships, as well as full-time will also be available starting in March 2018.

Throughout their action packed year, participants will receive a unique combination of skills and knowledge training, both marine and land-based, guaranteed on-the-job work experience, and customised entry level Lantra accredited course. They will also have the opportunity to work in partnership with a number of other organisations including the National Trust and Butterfly Conservation.

This innovative project aims to build on the success of the

existing Nature Skills Traineeship, also funded by HLF's Skills for the Future programme, which is now in its final year. During the last three years, over 700 applications were received for 18 fulltime traineeships, with two thirds of trainees gaining paid employment within the environment sector upon completion

Dawn Miskelly, Operations Director from Ulster Wildlife said: "We're delighted that the Heritage Lottery Fund is supporting this fantastic project This investment will enable us to offer more people, struggling to get their foot on the conservation ladder, paid training and high quality work experience with experts, which will set them up for the best possible career in natural heritage. This level of training provision is

in Northern Ireland and will help to bridge the skills gap in the sector and reach out to a more diverse generation of people wishing to embrace a future wild

The project is one of 18 across the UK which will help to address critical shortages specific heritage skills and widen the heritage talent pool.

Sir Peter Luff, Chair of the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), said: "There is no quick fix to this problem. The heritage sector has been slow in widening the profile of its work force and as a consequence is on a longterm learning curve.

"We wanted to build on the legacy of our existing targeted skills funding – £47m to date - and make a further financial commitment of just over £10m. Why? FORGET THE DARK NIGHTS, **SPRING HAS SPRUNG**

Later than last year, but spring is on the move

Though vou might be hard pressed to believe spring is well and truly on its way – that's according to Mother Snowdrops, Nature. lesser celandine and other seasonal beauties are already on the march and have been recorded on the Woodland Trust's project.

So far in 2017 the conservation charity has received sightings, across the UK, of 32 different indicators of spring; including snowdrops at 234 locations, 129 records of hazel catkins and even 48 records of song thrush singing.

Although spring definitely in the air, the Trust has received fewer records than this



time last year, which is explained by colder tem-peratures in early 2017 compared to 2016.

In Northern Ireland the earliest flowering snowdrop recorded this year was on 4 January (at Newtownards in County 'spring

earliest snowdrop was particularly early and was in fact recorded on 28 December 2015 (near Kircubbin, County Down).

According to the charity, while the recent spate of cold weather may slow the advance of

spring, it causes less of a problem than a late cold spell, when many more species may be flowering or awake from hibernation - as happened in 2013

ture's Calendar is hugely valuable to scientists and researchers who monitor its impact on nature. Although we're seeing signs slightly later this year, we expect to see many more as things finally begin to warm up.' Patrick Cregg is

director of the Woodland Trust in Northern Ireland and said:

"The recent wintry weather may make you think it's too early to look for signs of spring, but the clues are out there nonetheless and this is a great time to wrap up and get out and about.

"Look for lesser celandine flowering, hazel flowering, or even record your first lawn cut.

'We really need more people across Northern Ireland to play a part, and you don't have to be an expert. Your records no matter how few will make a valuable contribution to scientific research."

Trading Standards warn consumers about fake jewellery

The Northern Ireland Trading Standards Service (TSS) is reminding consumers when purchasing jewellery to always check the hallmark.

TSS recently seized a haul of jewellery including necklaces, bracelets, earrings and rings which did

not bear a valid hallmark certifying the gold or sterling silver's purity. Some of the seized jewellery had

foreign markings indicating the quality of the metal, but were not hallmarked as legally required in Europe. The seized items of jewel-lery will be analysed by an SLIPWAY COTTAGES Assay Office to discover if they really are the described precious metals.

Traders who supply or offer to supply unhall-marked articles described as gold, platinum, palladium or silver may be guilty of committing a criminal offence.

As it is not possible to detect by sight or touch the gold, silver, platinum or palladium content of an item, hallmarking is therefore a legal requirement under the Hallmarking Act 1973. Consumers can rely upon hallmarks as an assurance of the quality of precious metals.

When purchasing jewellery consumers should be aware of the following

In a retail outlet look out for the hallmarking notice, this is the British Hallmarking Council's notice for jewellers and silver-smiths. This sign, detailing UK hallmarking requirements, must be displayed

If an article is described as gold, silver, platinum palladium, always if the jewellery is hallmarked; this is your guarantee.

The hallmarking symbols are not always visible to the naked eye. Don't be afraid to ask for an eve glass to ensure the compulsory symbols are present.

Bear in mind that silver articles weighing less than 7.78grams, gold and palladium articles weighing less than 1 gram and platinum articles weighing less than 0.5 grams are exempt from

hallmarking requirements.

If an article of precious metal is not hallmarked it may be fake. A suspiciously low price may be an indicator of fake jewellery. If it is too good to be true, it often is.

This recent seizure of iewellery is an example of how TSS acts to protect local people and the interests of legitimate business.

THRIVING QASHQAI HITS **10-YEAR MILESTONE**

The Oashgai – the car Nissan claims created the crossover segment – is celebrating its 10th birthday.

Now in its second generation, the Japanese giant's iconic model is set to surpass a decade in production, marking a hugely successful venture and feat of UKbased engineering.

Since hitting the forecourt back in February 2007, the high-riding hatchback has notched an impressive 3.3 million sales worldwide, two-thirds of which have been made in Europe.

While the Matra Simca Rancho claims to have inspired the crossover genre back in the 1970s, there's little doubt the Qashqai was the car to inspire the car-buying public to take it to their hearts.

So much so, in fact, that the model was Britain's fifth-most popular car at the end of last year. The 60,000 units sold in the UK saw it prove a bigger draw than the likes of the ever-popular Volkswagen Polo, Vauxhall Astra and Mercedes C-Class.

Nissan believes it has as many as 21 direct competitors eyeing its position at the top of the crossover league table with rival models.

The UK received a massive economic boost last September when - in spite of the financial uncertainties sparked by the Brexit vote - Nissan announced it would build the next Qashqai and X-Trail models at its Sunderland factory,

safeguarding over 7,000

Qashqai being built today comes in two body styles, four trim levels and a choice of four engines, two petrol and two diesel.

Nissan says its 1.5-litre diesel engine is the most popular choice, with the majority of customers going for the mid-range N-Connecta trim and a six-speed manual gearbox.

The Japanese firm has long found considerable success on these shores





LIQUOR LICENCE HOLDERS **MUST GET THEIR HOUSE IN ORDER AHEAD OF 2017** RENEWAL DEADLINE

Owners of all types of licenced premises must take action now if they don't want to run out of time to renew their liquor licences ahead of the September 2017 deadline, a leading legal expert on liquor licensing has warned.

Cathy Colton, partner Carson McDowell, said most licence holders in Northern Ireland are aware that their licence is due for renewal in six months, but she is concerned that many have not vet started to put the necessary measures in place for a successful renewal.

Renewals occur once every five years and the deadline will impact every licenced premises in Northern Ireland. including pubs, bars, restaurants and clubs

Ms Colton said: 'Now is the time that licence holders should be getting ready for renewals by seeking advice on what the court requires at the renewal date. This is particularly important if any alterations, however minor, have been carried out on the premises since the last renewal in 2012."

"Whatever type of venue you have, if you sell alcohol you need to ensure that your house is in order. Renewals are coming and our advice is, don't rest on

your laurels, get started on it now. The process can take up to four months with only a few court dates set aside to deal with these applications. With courts closing at the end of June we are recommending

that anyone with alterations needs to seek approval prior to this date," she added.

"Carson McDowell has a team of liquor licensing experts who can provide advice on this process.


